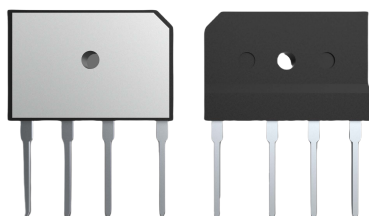
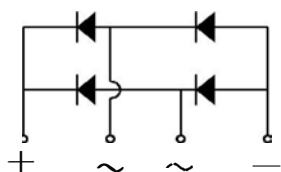

Fig.1 Current Derating, Case

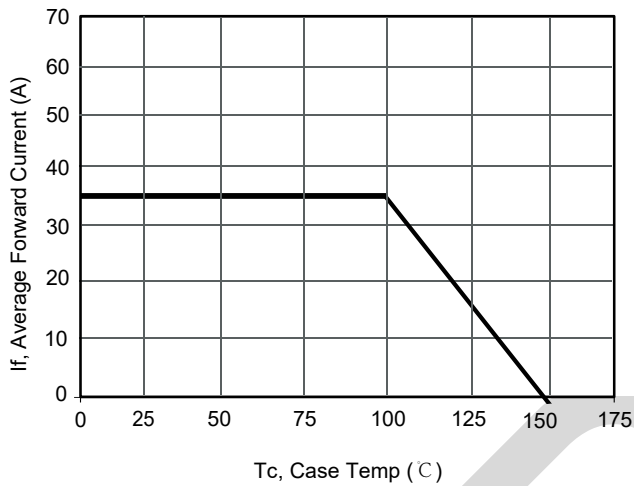


Fig.2 Maximum Non-Repetitive Peak Forward Surge Current

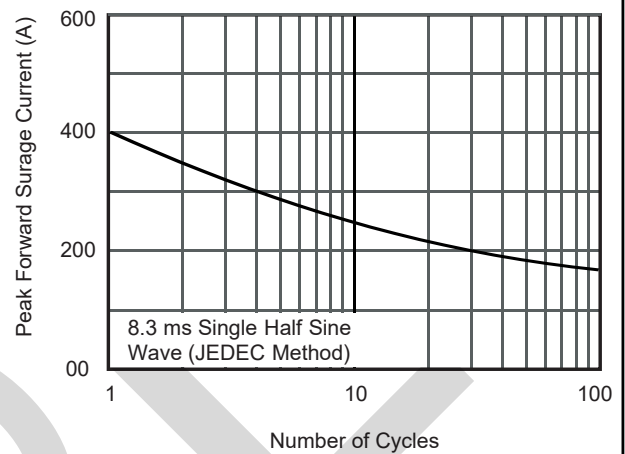


Fig.3 Typical Forward Voltage

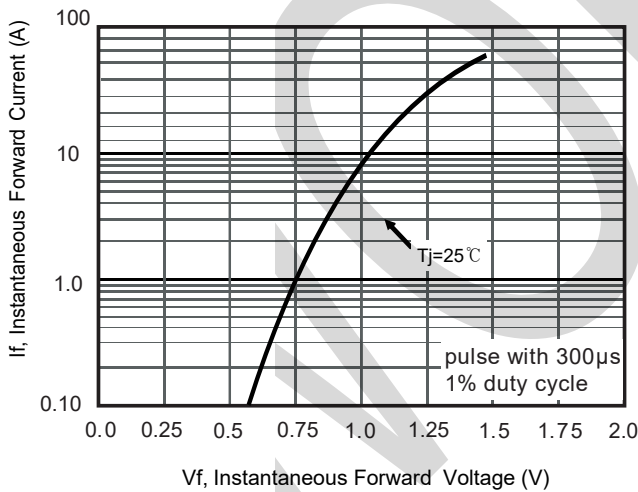
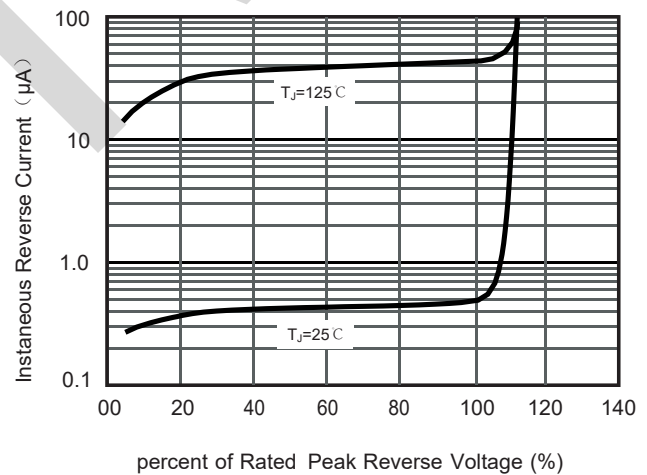
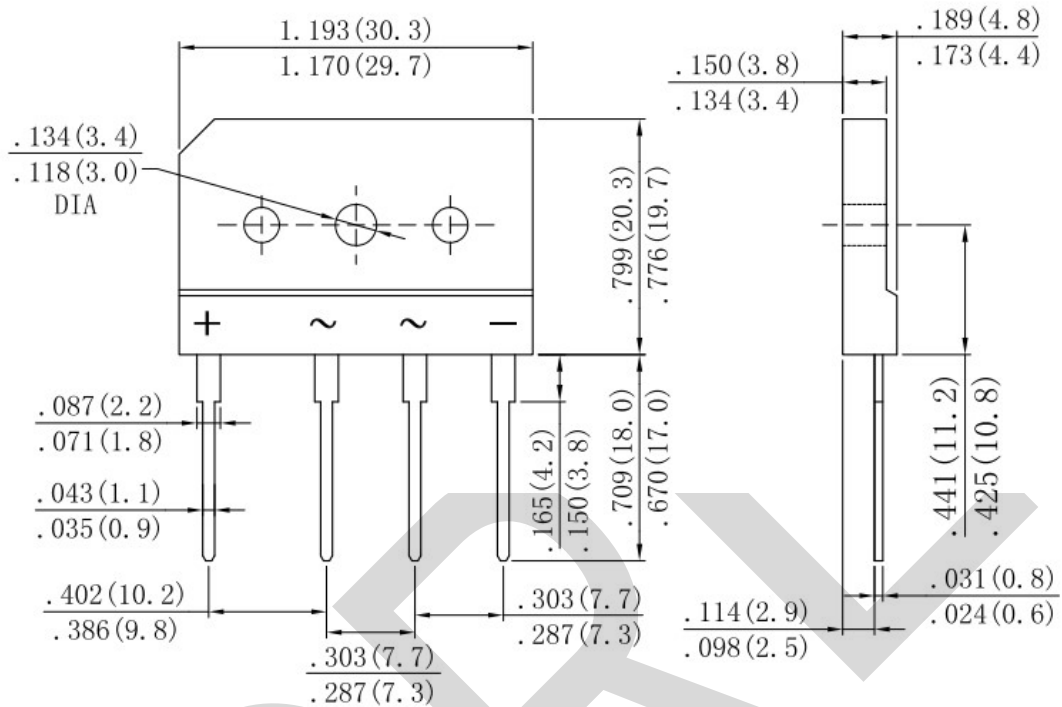


Fig.4 Typical Reverse Characteristics

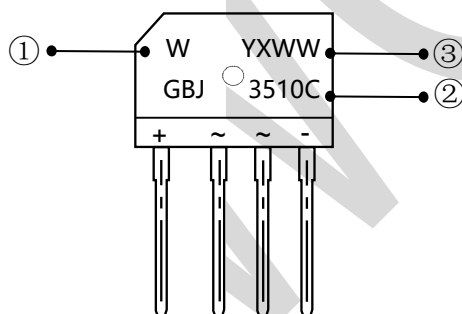
